I think it's going to be a moot point. Just talked with Dave StLaurent who was handling the engineering/survey with Gartly-Dorsky, he states that it's a no-go for that park. A portion of the park is a wetland and poses issues with permitting and such. So, we have two options left if we want to complete dredging at the fish pier; 1) Again look at the Rockland offshore dumping ground which will require us to spend +- \$70K for the proper testing of the material IAW ACOE requirements, or 2) Look for upland disposal with very hefty transportation costs. Dave says that it most likely will not work at the current landfill.
