Our board is made of of people who fish Penobscot Bay for lobsters, sea urchins, marine worms & finfish or use the bay for recreation.

Legacy waste identification and mitigation is a top priority, especially in the upper Bay estuary. As you may know, considerable federal monies are being poured into the betterment of the Penobscot Estuary (upper Penobscot Bay /lower Penobscot River). There may be remediation responses independent of Maine DEP (and resources) that EPA could avail itself of under that federal initiative.

This Kidder Point site is understood to be the worst land based coastal ocean acidification site in New England - See Dr Green report. Moreover we believe that GAC's CEO David Colter will support remediate of the wastes at the site if the costs are shared out enough that GAC doesn't have to take an overwhelming financial hit. Under CERCLA they won't, as several Potentially Responsible Party predecessors on the site still exist.

Kelsey we look forward to hearing from you. Please don't hesitate to contact me if you have any questions or are able to convince DEP wo work with the community and not be such a company advocate that discourages public participation. I think this is Maine DEP's geatest weak spot.
