Hi Louise,

The Moratorium directed the Energy Committee to provide a list of firms to the Planning Board that could provide technical support as requested by the Planning Board. As drafted the Planning Board could choose among those firms based upon the types of outside support the Board felt it needed to accomplish the task.

The Energy Committee initially recommended six firms and organizations with different combinations of expertise related to the questions raised by power generation facilities (technical, legal, environmental/energy policy, site plan review, etc.) to the Planning Board.

The Planning Board chose to request through the Manager that the City Attorney be used for ordinance drafting and legal work. The Planning Board at the same time requested that the Energy Committee select the engineering firm(s) to utilize.

The Energy Committee did not feel that any one firm had the range of skills to fully address the variety of questions raised. The Committee chose SMRT (who had participated in the forum last summer) as well as Woodard and Curran (which has a broad range of environmental, engineering and energy experience).

To the best of my knowledge, no funds have been paid to either firm. The amount authorized for each was capped at \$7,500 to insure that expenditures stayed well within the amount authorized by Council. I can provide folk with more documentation (meeting agendas and minutes, formal recommendation memos, etc.) if desired.

Hi Jim,

I reviewed all three documents. When did you see the Chanko contract for the first time? Today? Other than that the rest looks like subterfuge. It continues to appear Councilor Pritchett stepped outside of the bounds of his position. (Charter, Chapter 2:2.) of course I could be missing something here? Were there conversation between you and Larry where you allowed him to hire consultants?

I have seen the list of recommendations from the PB and the EC. That happens all the time. Agreeing on a consultant also happens all the time with committees and commissions. Yes, Council did approve monies for consultants. All of this is correct. The hiring contract is where

the snag lies. The hiring contract is a straight forward administrative responsibility. This role does not lie with committees, commissions, Chairs or individual Councillors.

As you know, one of my goals for this year is for, administration, committees, commissions, Chairs and Council to be very clear what their roles and responsibilities are. This is just another example of a major misunderstanding of procedure. This also has the possibility of opening the city to some liability.

Am I correct in assuming that you have not signed a contract with Chanko? If this is accurate, I recommend no payment until a contract is signed. I further recommend that this contract needs to come before Council. The overreaching by Councilor Pritchett is a concern as it is procedurally clear that these contracts are the City Manager's responsibility. Unless you see "keeping the manager at arm's length" as you giving Councillor Pritchett the go ahead to do your job? It is a bit alarming that any work was performed prior to a written agreement/contract with the City. In real life if someone submitted a bill to me without a contract I would not pay it.

A headache the city did not need.

Hi Jim.

Attached are two documents. You had asked in an email a while back for documentation on the selection/procurement process. As you noted in that earlier email, the Ordinance Amendment "kept the Manager at arm's length" in terms of that process.

I sent the 2/24 Energy memo earlier and noted that "all the Energy Committee did was take the 10 issue/question areas identified from the Public Forums in the 1/25/2016 report to the Planning Board and then add possible COI and availability. That was the criteria used."

I noted in that email that "if you want that info in a grid/matrix, Energy can provide that." But the narrative in the 2/24 memo is arguable adequate. I did not see a response to that question. So I am resending the 2/24 memo just to be sure that part is adequately wrapped up.

Also, attached is a draft "Scope of Services" for SMRT. Energy and SMRT both think the language is fine. Let me know if you think any changes are needed. An identical document (with the names changed) is under review at Woodard & Curran.

Hello Mayor,

If in fact any city councilor authorized an \$11,000 expenditure or any contracts, he violated Article Two, Section 2-204 Execution of Legal Documents.

The section reads" All legal documents requiring the assent of the city shall be (1) approved by the city council (2) signed by the Mayor on behalf of the council (3) attested thereon by the City Clerk, (4) approved thereon as to substance by the City Manager, and (5) approved thereon as to form by the City Attorney, unless otherwise provided by State law, the City Charter or a City ordinance." Any contract is a legal document. No councilor can obligate the city in any transaction outside the authority of the city council. I hope this helps. Have a great day,
