I was given your name by a group of Lincolnville residents who share concerns over the large proposed pier to be built at the end of Shag Rock road in Lincolnville. I live on the other side of a separating field from this property and share some concerns.

- 1) I worry about the precedent that could be set for the pristine coastline between Lincolnville Beach and Camden harbor. Private development without consideration for the local environment or the local waterfront use seems to be more apparent as the years go by.
- 2) That rocky coastline is such a pristine resource for not only shoreline walkers but also multiple small watercraft. We are unique with our access from the town beach for not only locals, but the many people who come to enjoy our wonderful state.
- 3) A large structure as is proposed for single use seems to be a bit shortsighted, and it does not appear that other options were seriously considered.

It is my hope that more guidelines are adopted to ensure that Maine is able to keep it's coastline available for all to enjoy. As society has become more mobile in the past several years, we need to be good stewards of accessible wild places, and help to educate those who may not consider what that truly means.
